They call themselves the "Moldy Oldies," yet they're anything but moldy and they're certainly young at heart. Their bonds of friendship were forged through their time in service to Pikes Peak Hospice & Palliative Care, and this informal group continues to gather on occasion.

A group of roughly 25 of these former PPHPC employees and volunteers came together in mid-September to share their experiences over lunch in El Pomar Town Hall at PPHPC's headquarters while also hearing organizational updates from President Dawn Darvalics and touring the new Inpatient Care Center.

Many who gathered that day had worked for PPHPC for 20 years or more. Some were among the very first volunteer class in 1980 and then went on to get their nursing licenses! They remembered an era before digital communications – sharing just one land-line phone and one pager, even documenting directions to patients' homes and the location of the nearest pay phone. Some shared stories of beloved Samantha the cat, who

comforted patients at the inpatient unit in their final hours

But most of all, those enjoying the time of camaraderie shared of a lifelong love of their work. As one person recalled: "It was the best job I ever had," to the knowing nods of many in the room. To them, their hospice work was personal. "We deal in relationships," one attendee pointed out. "The others deal in crisis."
